



## COMPLIANCE & REGULATORY

### Common Challenges For Home Care Providers (1.2 CE)

In this course, you will learn about common challenges that home care providers face including geography, communication, patient autonomy, medication administration and documentation issues.

### Corporate Compliance for Home Care

This program will explain the goals and components of the corporate compliance program as well as individual employees' roles and responsibilities.

### HIPAA: Protecting Patient Information

This course introduces important facts and responsibilities related to the privacy and security of protected patient information. It will help learners understand the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and prepare them to meet the obligations under the HIPAA standards.

### Home Care Regulations (1.1 CE)

This course provides a basic overview of the home care industry with a focus on home health and hospice. Topics addressed include the basic elements of certification, licensure and accreditation, reimbursement, referrals and performance improvement. This course also defines industry specific terms and disciplines.

### Hospice Conditions of Participation Part 1 - Subpart C (2.0 CE)

This course provides highlights of the Hospice Conditions of Participation, as well as what agencies need to do to maintain compliance. This course is part one of a two part series on the hospice conditions of participation. Part two focuses on Subpart D, Organizational Environment.

### Hospice Conditions of Participation Part 2 - Subpart D (1.7 CE)

This program provides highlights of the Hospice Conditions of Participation, Subpart D, Organizational Environment, as well as what agencies need to do to maintain compliance.

### Infection Control in Home Care and Hospice

This course covers the infection control practices applicable to care of the patient in the home setting. The OSHA Bloodborne Pathogens Standard and the CDC Transmission Precautions and CDC/WHO Hand Hygiene guidelines are reviewed.

### Introduction to Home Care (1.1 CE)

This course provides a basic overview of the home care and hospice industry. Topics addressed include types and care of services, challenges in home care, agency accreditation and licensure. This course also defines industry specific terms and disciplines.

### The Joint Commission Process for Home Care (1.4 CE)

This course discusses why the Joint Commission is important to your organization and to you as a staff member. Helpful tips for a successful Joint Commission survey are also included.

## Quality Improvement: It's Everyone's Job!

This course provides an overview of quality improvement and discusses the improvement goal in home care as the need to maintain what is good about existing systems while focusing on areas that need change.

## SAFETY

### Back Safety, Ergonomics and WMSDs

This course discusses back safety and the causes, signs and symptoms, as well as preventive measures of common work-related musculoskeletal disorders (WMSDs). Body mechanics and ergonomics are also defined and discussed in correlation to the work-related factors that may pose a risk of musculoskeletal disorders.

### Bloodborne Pathogens for Home Care

This course provides basic information regarding bloodborne pathogens, which are germs that cause infections and diseases. It also describes how to reduce your exposure and the risk of getting or spreading an infection through hand washing and other techniques.

### Defensive Driving

This series is designed to remind all staff about the basics of safe driving including what to check before starting the car engine, safety elements when operating a vehicle in traffic and tips on driving in bad weather.

### Disasters and Emergency Management (1.2 CE)

This course explains the components of a disaster plan developed and implemented by healthcare organizations to respond to a disaster, a hazard, or if an incident occurs.

### Electrical Safety for Home Care

This course explains how to safely use electrical equipment and identify electrical hazards in the home and office.

### Fire Safety for Home Care

This course will provide an understanding of how to prevent and safely respond to fires in the home and office. Includes information on the use of fire extinguishers, smoke detectors and how to safely handle evacuations.

### Hand Hygiene in Home Care

Keeping your hands clean by properly washing and disinfecting them helps protect the health of patients, families, and co-workers around you. This course explains the importance of proper hand hygiene and the use of alcohol-based hand cleansers.

### Hazardous Chemicals

This course provides an overview of the safe handling, use and disposal of hazardous chemicals and Oxygen.



### **Infectious Waste and Decontamination**

This course provides an understanding of what is considered infectious waste and how to store, transport, dispose of and decontaminate such waste.

### **Latex Allergy**

This course discusses latex allergy and how to reduce the risk to patients, coworkers, and yourself.

### **Patient Safety for Home Care**

This course provides an overview of current issues and regulations related to patient safety including information on fall prevention. The role and responsibilities of health care providers in promoting and assuring safe, quality patient care is also discussed.

### **Tuberculosis: What You Need to Know**

This course provides an understanding of tuberculosis (TB), including the symptoms, transmission and risk factors, and measures to prevent and control the spread of infection.

### **Workplace Violence**

Workplace violence is emerging as an important safety and health issue for all businesses, including health care organizations. This course discusses the types of workplace violence that can occur and tips for prevention.

## **SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY / ADVOCACY**

### **Domestic Violence, Abuse & Neglect (1.2 CE)**

Domestic violence, abuse & neglect is a serious and widespread public health problem in the United States. This course discusses the prevalence of domestic violence, elder abuse, types and indicators of abuse and the related responsibilities of health care providers.

### **Health Care Advance Directives**

This course outlines the purpose and types of Health Care Advance Directives (ADs). Additionally, you will learn about the responsibilities of health care providers in regards to ADs.

### **Introduction to Ethics**

This course discusses core ethical values and provides a review of common ethical issues. Through examples, learners will gain a broader awareness of issues that might require a consultation with your organization's ethics committee.

### **Sexual Harassment in the Workplace**

This course provides a basic overview of sexual harassment in the workplace. Sexual harassment can affect anyone. Preventing harassment in the workplace is everyone's responsibility.

### **Sexual Harassment Training**

This series is for leadership, managers and staff and provides an overview of sexual harassment in the workplace, discusses behaviors and actions that constitute sexual harassment and regulations that govern workplace discrimination and workplace bias. Several scenarios to help managers and staff understand their role in various situations involving harassment and discrimination are defined.

## CLINICAL DEVELOPMENT

### Age Specific Care for Adult (1.0 CE)

This program provides an overview of age-specific developmental stages of the life span for adulthood, and the related physical, cognitive and psychosocial needs of the patient and family. By incorporating this knowledge into your assessment and care planning, you will be more effective in providing respectful, considerate and competent care to patients.

### Age Specific Competencies for Home Care Pediatrics: Birth to Adolescence (1.0 CE)

This course reviews age-specific growth and development, from infancy through adolescence. This includes physical, mental and emotional needs of the patient and family. By understanding and using this knowledge in assessment and care planning, you will be more effective in providing positive patient outcomes.

### Assessing Fall Risk in the Elderly (1.5 CE)

By virtue of their advancing age combined with associated health issues, the homecare and hospice patient populations are at heightened risk for falls. This module will explore the problem of falling and the need to identify those who are the highest risk of falling so that effective interventions can be applied.

### Basic Medication Calculation (1.0 CE)

This course provides information and instruction on basic medication calculations and conversion methods. Commonly used formulas are described, using practical examples, and medication safety in the home is discussed.



### **Basic Vestibular Training**

This course will identify the various signs and symptoms of Benign Paroxysmal Positional Vertigo (BPPV). In addition, diagnostic tests, recommended treatment and other peripheral vestibular disorders will be discussed.

### **Cancer Chemotherapy: Gastrointestinal Tract Toxicities (1.9 CE)**

Chemotherapy is used to treat many types of cancers. Gastrointestinal tract toxicities can cause significant distress to individuals with cancer and impact their quality of life. The pathophysiology, clinical manifestations, assessment, and nursing interventions for nausea and vomiting, mucositis, diarrhea, constipation, and anorexia will be explored in this course.

### **Care of the Dying (1.4 CE)**

This course will provide an overview of care of the dying, the growth of palliative and hospice care services and common practices in end of life care in the United States.

### **Caring for Patients with Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia**

This course will provide an overview of Alzheimer's disease and other related dementia and provide strategies for caring for the patient in the home environment. The course discusses the causes of dementia and how to safely and effectively care for patients with the various types of dementia.

### **Coding Basics in Home Care (1.0 CE)**

This program reviews general principles and guidelines for selecting the best diagnoses to support home care services. The course will assist clinicians in identifying common diagnosis types used in home care as well as describe case mix diagnoses and how they impact reimbursement.

### **Diabetes Update for Home Care Teams (1.6 CE)**

This course is designed to provide an overview of the types of Diabetes, the causes of Diabetes and current treatment modalities, as well as the complications that arise from Diabetes.

### **Diabetic Foot Care**

This course will explain the causes of diabetic foot problems and how patients can manage their foot care with the help of home care professionals to prevent problems from occurring or worsening. Practice standards for home health (HH)/hospice aides and licensed professionals are discussed and task distinctions are stated.

### **Elder Abuse: Assessment of the Patient in Home Care (1.9 CE)**

This course provides an overview of elder abuse. The course will cover the various forms of elder abuse including signs and symptoms, assessment, and typical abusers.

### **Extreme Weather: Elder Care Winter to Summer (1.0 CE)**

This course will provide an overview of heat and cold related safety issues and how with aging, the body changes which affects our ability to adapt to extreme weather. Strategies for caring for patients in the home during extreme weather are also discussed.

### **Hospice 101 (1.2 CE)**

This course provides a basic overview of the hospice benefit with a focus on the different services hospices provide that set them apart from other home care providers. Topics addressed are case management, reimbursement, local coverage determinations (LCDs), documentation and the interdisciplinary group (IDG).

### **Hospice 201 (2.0 CE)**

This course provides an overview of the Medicare hospice levels of care, including qualifications and documentation requirements, as well as an overview of the Medicare covered services.

### **Hospice Comprehensive Assessment and Plan of Care (2.1 CE)**

After completing this course, staff will realize the necessary plan of care components for hospice patients that reside in facilities and in the home, comprehend the requirements for the initial and comprehensive assessments, understand the required plan of care changes when patients are transferred to different levels of care, and understand the cycle of care and the role of the interdisciplinary group (IDG) in care planning.

### **Influenza (1.0 CE)**

This course will provide an overview of the major types of Influenza, the associated symptoms, recommended treatment and prevention guidelines. The information will be valuable as you care for patients in the home setting, especially during "flu" season.

### **Management of Lower Extremity Ulcers (2.5 CE)**

This course covers the pathophysiology and management of the three most common types of lower extremity ulcers: venous ulcers, arterial ulcers, and diabetic ulcers. The objectives of this course include differentiating between the assessment findings for the most common types of lower extremity ulcers and identifying the recommended treatment strategies for each type of lower extremity ulcer.

### **Management of Pressure Ulcers (2.5 CE)**

This course provides a review of assessment and treatment strategies for home care and hospice patients with pressure ulcers. Objectives include identifying risk factors for pressure ulcer development, demonstrating appropriate pressure ulcer assessment and staging skills, describing measures to prevent pressure ulcer development, and how to manage underlying causes of pressure ulcers.

### **Pain Management in the Cognitively Impaired Elderly Patient (1.0)**

Despite the prevalence and the consequences of pain among older adults, pain is often inadequately recognized and treated, especially in the elderly with cognitive impairment. This course will provide recommendations and the necessary key elements to assessing pain in those with cognitive impairment.



### **Pain Management: Assessment of Pain (1.7 CE)**

This course discusses assessment as the foundation of pain management. Specifically addressed are the elements of a complete pain assessment, pain intensity scales, and the role of critical judgment in managing adult, child & infant pain effectively.

### **Pharmacology and Management of Pain (1.0)**

This course discusses pharmacological management of pain. Additionally, the categories of analgesics are discussed as well as their role in achieving balanced analgesia.

### **Pharmacology for Therapists**

This course outlines numerous disease conditions, indicated medications and the mechanisms of action of the medications. In addition, therapists will gain knowledge on the importance of understanding the requirements surrounding medication management and the importance of a knowledge of pharmacology.

### **Recipe for Effective Documentation in Home Care and Hospice (1.0 CE)**

This program reviews general ingredients and guidelines for successful documentation that meets regulatory and compliance standards. Helpful guidelines for successful documentation tips are covered—both the do's and don'ts to assist in completing proper documentation and preventing clinical record flambé.

### **Suicide in the Elderly (1.3 CE)**

This course provides the clinician with assistance in identifying the warning signs of suicidal ideation in the elderly. In addition, risk behaviors, common myths regarding suicidal behavior and strategies for crisis intervention are covered.

### **Symptom Management of the Heart Failure Patient (2.1 CE)**

This course will cover in detail the medication treatment modalities and medication combinations used to treat chronic heart failure. Included in this course are types of heart failure, causes of heart failure, and common symptoms. Recommended clinical interventions and adjunctive treatments are also outlined.

### **Team Approach to Home Therapy (1.7 CE)**

This course provides an overview of the team approach to therapy in the home. This course describes how the interdisciplinary therapy team; including therapists, nurses, aides and caregivers work together to provide optimum care for the patient. It also provides an overview of the team's role in fall prevention; and examples of the therapy techniques used in rehabilitation maintenance programs.

### **Therapy in Home Care (1.3 CE)**

This course provides a basic overview of how therapy is provided in the home setting for patients receiving home health and hospice care. This course defines the various types of therapy services and how they can be utilized to improve patient outcomes and quality of life.

### **Understanding Dementia and Alzheimer's Disease (2.4 CE)**

This course will provide an overview of Alzheimer's disease, the causes, risk factors, effects on the brain and associated medical complications. The behaviors that patients exhibit in the seven stages of dementia and strategies for caring for these patients in the home environment, as well as how to help manage the behaviors seen in progressive dementia and Alzheimer's Disease will also be reviewed.

### **Wound Care Basics (3.1 CE)**

This course provides an overview of wound care strategies for the most common wounds managed in the home environment. You will learn how to describe risk factors for skin breakdown, demonstrate the ability to perform and document a comprehensive wound assessment, identify the type of wound based on assessment findings and the patient's history, and how to verbalize treatment strategies to promote wound healing based on the type of wound identified.

## **SAGE Collection (Video Courses)**

### **Model 1: Aging and Mental Health**

This module will provide an in-depth explanation of integrating mental health into occupational therapy for older adults. It will discuss taking a thorough history of current disability and the impact on mood. Performing screening for cognition and depression will also be introduced.

### **Model 2: Understanding and Treating Depression**

This course will provide an explanation of the MacNeill-Lichtenberg Decision Tree (MLDT) for older adults. The MLDT evaluates cognitive measures, emotional status and psychosocial indicators including environmental demands.

### **Model 3: Medications for Depression**

This course will provide an overview of medications commonly used for depression in older adults. It also will cover the causes of depression, signs and symptoms and treatment modalities and consequences.

### **Model 4: Family Caregiving**

This course will provide an overview of the importance families have as members of the healthcare team for older adults and the impact families have on patients in terms of social support, medication dispensing and oversight and overall care.

### **Model 5: Falls, Balance and Exercise**

This course provides a description of the connection between falls, balance and exercise in older adults and how these factors may impact depression. Case studies are presented that reinforce the importance of preventative measures to be used to encourage and maintain independence that will assist the older adult to remain in their home.



### **Model 6: Driving Rehabilitation and Communication**

This course will provide a connection between mobility and how it impacts the quality of life in older adults. Case studies are presented to help demonstrate techniques to evaluate an older adult's abilities as they pertain to driving and alternative modes of mobility.

## **OASIS TRAINING**

### **OASIS-C Assessment & Coding of Wounds (3.1 CE)**

This course provides an overview of standards related to documentation of wounds on the OASIS comprehensive assessment as well as guidelines for accurately coding the most common types of wounds managed in home care. This course will demonstrate how to use the WOCN Society Guidance on OASIS Skin and Wound Status M0 Items to accurately document skin lesions on the OASIS Assessment, and how to select and properly sequence the most accurate diagnosis codes for home patients.

### **OASIS-C: The Basics (1.0 CE)**

This program provides introductory guidelines for completion of the OASIS-C comprehensive assessment. At the completion of this course, the learner will be able to identify the clinical and financial impact of the OASIS, discuss accepted conventions and guidance related to the completion of the OASIS and describe each OASIS time point and associated documentation criteria.

### **OASIS-C: Beyond the Basics (2.0 CE)**

This program provides advanced concepts in the completion of the OASIS-C comprehensive assessment. The focus of this course is key data elements that impact payment, outcomes and adverse events. Proper diagnosis order and coding is also discussed. Clinicians are encouraged to take the OASIS-C: The Basics course as a pre-requisite to this program.

### **OASIS-C: Introducing the Changes (1.0 CE)**

The Outcome and Assessment Information Set, or OASIS, includes a data set of assessment items that must be collected by qualified clinicians at specific time points while providing home care services to Medicare and Medicaid beneficiaries. Version C of this document is a revision that was implemented January 1, 2010 and will replace version B1. This course is designed to introduce the major changes and requirements for OASIS-C.

### **OASIS-C Room by Room (1.5 CE)**

This course provides details for completing an accurate comprehensive OASIS assessment by listing a scenario-based review of key elements that impact patient outcomes, case mix and adverse events. By using each room in the patient's home as a scenario, clinicians will learn the importance of using interview, observation and demonstration when completing the OASIS assessment.

## **OASIS Competency Tests**

This series contains three scenario-based tests designed to measure the clinician's competency in completing the OASIS. It is imperative that clinicians understand the importance of conducting an accurate, comprehensive assessment and how this impacts the patient's plan of care, clinical outcomes and reimbursement.

**Part Three:** Functional & Service Domain Knowledge
